IMPORT PROHIBITION LIST (TRADE)

RE: AMENDMENT TO THE IMPORT PROHIBITION CIRCULAR

(TRADE) NO. BD. 12237/S.25/VOL.285 OF 6<sup>TH</sup> APRIL, 2005

I am directed to forward herewith Federal Ministry of Finance letter reference No. BD.12237/S.731/VOL.1/42 of 31<sup>st</sup> October, 2006 on the **removal of some textile fabric and articles of textile** from the Import Prohibition list (Trade).

You are to particularly note that all the articles so removed shall ONLY be imported through Apapa Port, Tincan Island Port, Port Harcourt Port, Murtala Mohammed International Airport, Ikeja and Malam Aminu Kano International Airport, Kano. This circular takes effect from 31st October, 2006.

Ensure strict implementation, please.

## APPROVAL FOR THE REMOVAL OF SOME TEXTILES FABRICS AND ARTICLES OF TEXTILES FROM THE IMPORT PROHIBITION LIST(TRADE) RE: AMENDMENT TO THE IMPORT PROHIBITION CIRCULAR (TRADE) NO. BD. 12237/S.25/VOL.285 OF 6<sup>TH</sup> APRIL, 2005

The Federal Executive Council (FEC) has approved further amendment of the Import Prohibition List [Trade] Ref. No. BD.12237/S.25/Vol. 285 of  $6^{th}$  April, 2005, in respect of Textile Fabrics of all types and articles thereof and yarn, falling under Chapters 50-63 in order to address the problems of Garment and Furniture Manufacturers. By this approval therefore, only the underlisted items of textile fabrics and yarn shall continue to remain under import prohibition:

- [a] African Print [Printed Fabrics] e.g. Nigeria wax, Ankara and similar fabrics falling under the following HS.Codes 5208.5100-5208.5900, 5209.5100 5209.5900, 5210.5100, 5210.5900, 5211.5100 5211.5900, 5212.5100, 5212.2500, 5407.4400, 5407.5400, 5407.7400, 5407.8400, 5407.9400, 5408.3400, 5408.2400, 5513.4100-5513.4900, 5514.4100-5514.4900, 5516.1400, 5516.2400, 5516.3400, 5516.4400 and 5514.9400.
- [b] Lace Fabrics, Georges and other embroided Fabrics falling under HS.Codes 5801.1000 – 5811.0000.
- [c] Carpets of HS.Codes 5701.1000 5705.0000
- [d] Made-up Garments and other Textile articles, including Towels, falling under HS.Codes 6101.1000 - 6310.9000.
- Yarn falling under the following HS.Codes shall remain prohibited from importation:
  - i. 5004.0000 5006.0000
  - ii. 5106.1000 5110.0000
  - iii. 5204.1100 5207.9000
  - iv. 5306.1000 5308.9000
  - v. 5401,1000 5406,2000
  - vi. 5402,3300 and 5402,6200
  - vii. 5508.1000 5511.3000
- Please note that Polyester Filament Yarn although still under prohibition attracts
   duty as against 10% as contained in the new Tariff Book. All other Textile fabrics

and articles thereof NOT listed in paragraphs 1 and 2 above are hereby removed from Import Prohibition. It should also be noted that the following items which were earlier exempted from Import Prohibition, vide circular No. BD.12237/S.25/Vol.285 of 6<sup>th</sup> April, 2005 shall remain exempted.

- Garments accessories HS, Codes 6117.8000 9000 and 6217.1000 -9000.
- ii. . Mosquito Nets HS.Codes 6304.9100 6304.9900 ( for one year only).
- iii. Gloves for Industrial use HS.Codes 6116.1000 6116.9900.
- iv. Moulding cup Lyera HS.Code 6212.9000.
- v. Mutilated Rags HS.Code 6310.11000.
- vi. Jute Bags HS.Code 6305.1000.00.
- Furthermore, all the items removed from Import Prohibition List, shall remain exempted for a period of one year only and shall attract 20% import duty plus 30% levy, amounting to 50%, in order to encourage local production.
- 5. The Federal Executive Council has also approved that Embroidery Lace Manufacturers shall continue to enjoy the Special Concession granted them on the importation of their raw materials of Specialized Yarn and Base Fabrics (Base Cloth) for a period of another one year only, at 10% duty rate with effect from the date of this circular. The approval covers the following items:-
  - Yarn of HS.Codes 5401.2000, 5402.3300 and 5402.6200.
  - [jil Metallic Yarn HS.Code 5605.0000
  - [iii] Viscose Yarn [Rayon and Filament] HS.Code 5403.3100, 5403.3200 and 5403.4100.
  - [iv] Base Fabrics HS.Codes 5208.1100, 5208.2100, 5208.3100, 5512.1100 – 5512.1900.
- 6. Also Carpet Manufacturers shall continue to enjoy the Special Concession granted them on the importation of the following carpet yarn for a period of another one year at 10%, duty rate effective from the date of this circular.

These yarn are as follows:-

- [i] Jute yarn H.S. Code 5307.1000 2000
- [ii] Aerylic yarn H.S. 5509.31000 3200.
- [iii] Polypropylene yarn and High Tenacity yarn of nylon

H.S. Codes 5402.1000, 5402.3100, 5402.3200, 5402.3900, 5402.4100, 5402.4900, 5402.5100, 5402.5900, 5402.6100 and 5402.6900.

- 7. In view of the new Government Policy on control and regulation on the importation of textiles, all textiles fabries and articles thereof, removed from import prohibition shall be imported only through the following approved Sea and Air Ports: -
  - Apapa Port
  - ii. Tin Can Island Port
  - iii. Port Harcourt Port
  - iv. Murtala Mohammed International Airport, Ikeja.
  - v. Malam Aminu Kano International Airport, Kano.

For the purpose of emphasis, no importation of Textile fabrics and articles thereof shall be allowed through Land Borders.

8. This Circular takes immediate effect.
